

Welcome to everyone today and especially those who have travelled far and wide to be here. A great effort!

I was Abbie Williams and represent the Class of 2000 here today. Over the last week or so I have been giving some thought to my secondary years at St Mark's College. It's a cliche, I know, but it seems like yesterday when I started at St Mark's as a Year 10 boarding student in 1998. At that time the Boarding House was in Crystal Brook and we would catch the bus to and from the Brook each day past the (fully functioning) abattoir everyday (as Carly Pavy reminded me on our way in!).

I remember feeling nervous and overwhelmed at the sheer size of the school. I was extremely homesick in my first term here. However, I stuck it out and am very thankful today that I did. It taught me resilience, independence and I gained so many new friendships and networks as a result of my time at St Mark's.

Coming back to the school today it certainly looks very different but in a good way - it's welcoming, sheltered and the facilities are certainly impressive.

I was fortunate enough to come to the school with a few of my friends from Orroroo - Danielle Piggott (who is also my cousin and we remain close today), Annie Chapman and Josh Byerlee. It was nice to go through the entirety of our schooling together.

After Year 12, I attended the University of Adelaide and gained a Bachelor of Commerce. I wouldn't say that I enjoyed University, but it was a means to an end for me, and was only a 3 year degree! After Uni, I got a job with the Auditor General's Department then with SA Health and moved to Crystal Brook (where my husband Shane is from) almost 11 years ago. We still live

He would follow Brother John around and chat with us all about his beloved football teams - the Brookies, the Roosters and the Crows! I also remember our daily bus trips where Trish the bus driver would make everyone say "good morning Trish" every morning or there would be trouble.

At school, I remember...

Mr Lacey teaching us random words from the dictionary in science - oifros and plethora spring to mind for some reason?!

Paul Fogarty's in depth knowledge of all things

history and religion in Mrs Gibson's class.

Ryan Arbon being our in class tutor in Maths 2 (and probably every other subject he was in).

And who could forget Robert Stephens rocking up in his red sports car everyday?!

My cousin Danielle giving us haircuts at the Boarding Home and Monday night 'Street Nights', lining up for our \$1 bucket of chips from Harry's Deli.

I remember the Graduation and all the different shades of blue dresses we wore that night! It must have been the colour of the season!

While I don't have a lot of connection to the school at the moment, we will be looking at sending our children here for schooling in the future.

St Mark's has been important to me because it was a massive period of personal growth - being away from home and learning to be independent from a young age.

DR. SARAH (BOYLE) KILEY,

Sarah is a breast cancer researcher at The Centre for Cancer Biology in Adelaide. She is also a keen supporter of The Longest Table campaign (running now until the end of September), which provides vital funding for The Hospital Research Foundation.

Like many others, my family has been affected by cancer. Not only breast cancer, but also pancreatic, brain, blood and lung cancers. The possibility that I may in some way make a difference to future generations, to help make cancer a manageable disease rather than a death sentence, is what drives my passion for research.

I finished Year 12 at St Mark's in 2005, and my best friend was Tiphanie Kemp (now Tiphanie Scarman). My favourite memories of the College are the Year 12 Retreat at Port Hughes and being involved with school musicals (The Three Musketeers in 2001 and Back to the 80s in 2003). There were many other wonderful teachers that I have fond memories of, however I loved Visual Arts and Biology, and Mrs Congdon and Mr Heinrich who were my teachers for those subjects respectively. I was torn between pursuing careers in those two fields. I took a gap year immediately after school, and worked in Port Pirie until September 2006 when I moved to Adelaide to start a Bachelor of Science at the University of Adelaide the following year. I completed my Bachelors in 2010, my Honours degree in 2011, and my Doctorate (PhD) degree in 2015.

My studies led me to a career in medical research at The Centre for Cancer Biology. I work in a laboratory doing fundamental research into the causes and progression of breast cancer, with the ultimate goal of helping develop new treatments for cancer. More specifically, I investigate how cancer cells 'talk' to other normal cells in the body, such as immune cells, and hijack them to help the cancer to grow rather than kill it. To do this, I design specific experiments that help me to answer a scientific question and address a hypothesis. A 'day in the office' is a mix of experimental work – at the lab

bench, culturing cells or at the microscope – and computer work including analysing results, putting together applications for funding, and writing scientific papers. More widely, I also help supervise new students and assistants, attend conferences, and give data presentations. I am currently supported by The Hospital Research Foundation with whom I have a fellowship, and I am very grateful for their support of me and my research. Work aside, I live in Adelaide with my husband and son. I enjoy going to shows and gigs especially during the Fringe Festival, spending time with my close group of friends, and travelling when I can.

I also love good food and wine. The major annual fundraiser for The Hospital Research Foundation is The Longest Table campaign. I myself have been hosting a Longest Table for the last 4 years and it is a great, fun way to raise money for cancer research. Emily has always been well know in the College community for her outstanding soccer abilities, competing at a National level for the Young Matilda's. Now she is in the spotlight as one of SA's newly awarded Young Achievers.

My Year 12 year was quite different to that of my peers in the Class of 2016. Amongst the usual pressures of homework, assignments and exams I was playing soccer for the Young Matildas, travelling to Myanmar and Nanjing for qualifying tournaments for the World Cup. I returned from China on the eve of Year 12 exams!



Soccer has been my life since first putting on the boots for St Mark's when I was 7 years old. Back then there were only a handful of girls playing soccer and generally I was the only girl in the team. I represented the school, then Port Pirie and at the age of 11, I started representing South Australia at the Nationals.

When I reached high school I started playing for clubs in Adelaide as well as State teams. This meant a lot of travel after school and on weekends. In Year 8, I tried my luck and was selected for an Under 19 State Team with other players who were years ahead of me in age. We had a great tournament, winning a silver medal and to my surprise I was selected for the Australian team to tour Brazil and Argentina!

I signed my first Adelaide United contract aged 15, becoming the youngest ever player to be signed. I have just completed my eighth season with the club and have made the most player appearances for the women's team.

During Year 12, I completed a Certificate 3 in Fitness. With my interest in this area, it was a subject that I was able to fit into my heavy schedule without too much fuss.

While life was hectic, I wouldn't change it. My friends from that year were Brittany, Merina and Louise, although I didn't really get to socialise out of school with friends much as I was always in Adelaide training or playing.

After completing Year 12 I moved to Adelaide to live with my Nan as at it was easier than travelling back and forth from Pirie so many times a week. During this time I completed my Certificate 4 in Fitness and also completed an online business and financial course. In 2018, I lived in Sydney as part of a scholarship program for the Future Matildas. When I returned from Sydney I resumed work as a Personal Trainer at a gym.

I have been so fortunate to have been selected to play for the Young Matilda's on several occasions throughout my soccer career and I made my senior debut for the Matilda's at the 2018 Algarve Cup in Portugal. I became #200 capped Australian woman, it is certainly a huge honour to represent your country!

My business, EC Advantage, came about as I wanted to pursue a career that combined

both of my passions; fitness and soccer. EC Advantage allows me to work with players from all levels either on a one on one basis or in a team environment.

It was one year to the day from launching EC Advantage to the 7 News Young Achiever Awards ceremony! It was a lovely surprise when I found out that someone (anonymously) had nominated me for the Worldwide Small Business Award. A few weeks later I received the news that I was one of three finalists in this category, which was humbling, as there were many worthy nominations.

The Awards Ceremony was held at the Hilton during May this year. I was hugely honoured and surprised to receive the award for my business and it was amazing to see so many young, passionate and committed young South Australians all doing great things in and about the community.

Currently I'm playing for Salisbury Inter in the SA WNPL in the off season and will return to Adelaide United for my ninth season later in the year. When I'm not training with my team I am coaching or training others either through EC Advantage or at the gym, life is hectic, but wonderful!

George has officially made the record books! Over the past two weeks George has been part of a team of three pilots and four support crew operating the only electric aircraft in South Australia.

It is an honour to get to fly an electric aircraft. There are only 6 pilots in Australia who are certified to fly the electric aircraft and I am lucky enough to be one of them. More people have been to space than have flown electric aircraft-to me that is very special! We only completed the record a week ago on 28 June, so it still has not quiet hit me yet what we have achived.

On our journey, we officially broke the World Records for the:

- Longest flight in an electric aircraft,
- Longest electric flight over water- 31km,
- Fastest average speed of an electric aircraft 177km/h.

Leaving Parafield, the aircraft needed to stop every 125km to charge, meaning stops at 25 regional airports across Australia before ending the journey at Adelaide Airport. The team flew an amazing 1313.5km over the course of the journey, absolutely smashing the previous record by 563.5km. When not flying the electric aircraft, I was flying a conventional powered aircraft as a camera platform for the journey.

What I really enjoy about flying is being able to just let go of anything else that may be going on at that time and being in the moment. Stewart Michael (Class of 2002) has an airfield at Snowtown that I visit quiet regularly. I have some very fun friends who fly aerobatics and on an airstrip at Port Lincoln, so I can leave Jamestown and 1.5 hours later be in Lincoln having a rum and coke at the pub.

My fondest memory of school would have to be Year 12 Retreat, getting those few days way with our cohort is something I don't think any of us will forget. My favourite subject at school was Tech Wood, however I think I gave Mr Murphy a few headaches during that time! I definitely bit of more than I could chew for my TV cabinet design.

I feel like all of the teachers at St Marks were



very influential on my schooling however a few notable teachers who really went the extra mile for me include; Mr Gibson, Mrs Gibson, Sir, Miss Russack, Mrs Haskett and Mrs (Marg) Congdon. I really enjoyed studying Aviation while in Year 10 and 11. I am thankful that the school let me travel to MNCC for 1 week each term to study something that I was truly passionate about.

I was lucky enough to be part of the Boarding Family at St Mark's. Mr and Mrs Arbon made my time in the boarding house very enjoyable. All of us boarders still catch up every now and then. I keep in touch with quiet a few people from my Class of 2017 and I think I have taken quite a few of them flying now!

Immediately after school I moved to Adelaide with Kloe Jaesckhe where I started at UNI SA studying a Bachelor of Aviation, while doing this! was managing a bottleshop in Sailsbury.

After a week at Uni I decided this wasn't for me and went full time at the bottle shop. After 2 years there I came home to Jamestown as I was having some issues with my health.

I am now back living in Jamestown and working as a Funeral Director for Northern Area Funerals, and a school photographer for Clive Palmer

at MSP Photograpy. I am also working for a company selling planes and digital aviation logbooks, and for Recreational Aviation Australia in a youth engagement role. Life is full, but I wouldn't change it!

In true George-style, this article was written at 6,500 feet in the air going over the Spencer Gulf-thankfully, he wasn't the pilot at the time!
