# WHY DO WE HAVE TWO COLLECTIONS AT SUNDAY MASS?

This is a question that is often asked. Both collections are equally important and are used for two distinct purposes.

The **FIRST COLLECTION** goes into the Diocesan Clergy Support Fund and is for the upkeep and support of all the Diocesan Priests, Deacons and the Bishop, in providing them with living expenses, housekeeping support, health care, medical insurance, and subsidises those priest in Residential Care.

The **SECOND COLLECTION** includes the Parish Planned Giving Programme which is the main source of our parish income. The Second Collection funds are used for the day to day operating costs of our parish. That is to pay for the parish property maintenance and repairs, wages, insurance, utilities, liturgical needs, and the many other expenses incurred to keep our parish functioning towards the growth of our parish's vision and mission.

A portion of the total Second Collection together with any other parish income, is paid by every parish as a Diocesan Levy to the Diocesan Support Fund each year. This Fund assists in the operating costs of the Diocesan agencies in the administration of the Diocese, and also supports some of the Diocesan outreach services as well.

The **Leaving Collections** are for specific appeals and special intentions.

#### **HOW YOU CAN PARTICIPATE**

Contributions to the Second Collection are made via the Parish Planned Giving Programme and conducted by using Weekly Offertory Envelopes, Credit Card Authority, Direct Debit Authority, or On-Line Fund transfers from a nominated Bank Account.

To participate in Parish Planned Giving, please complete the details on the enclosed Commitment Card and return to the Parish Office. The required procedure and arrangements will then be sent to you.
