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Our year has been extraordinary

Extraordinary happens when 1,000 people have determination and hope. Extraordinary happens when we develop and grow as a community. Extraordinary happens when we are focussed and work hard. And it has happened. There have been significant achievements. There has been learning. We have been still together in faithfulness. Most importantly, the students have had a chance to become all that they are supposed to become. It has been hugely successful. The year began when the entire staff of St Mark's headed down to Adelaide to begin our school year with a conference. We all attended an event called "Live, Lead, Learn". We got onto a bus at 5.30 in morning and headed to the Entertainment Centre. There was an impressive gathering of 5,500 people from Catholic Education. The speakers and process helped us to define our purpose and give us focus for the year. This Report is an expression of the aspirations of this event.

Great Events

I am conscious that at the College we create great events. These are moments that express the best of us and give us a chance to define what we value. The College is conscious that we touch deep sacredness when we gather. It happens because when we are two or three gathered in his name it is holy. These gathering times are the announcements of goodbye, rituals and affirmation, and the celebrations of achievement. There are sporting triumphs, creative inspirations, boarding house delights, learning astonishments. There are prayer times and festivals for social justice. These are important times of gathering and in being together we are enriched and we grow. The executive of the College encourages, the teachers make it happen and the presence of parents reassures and gives strength to our common purpose. Our extraordinary Marketing Officer, Catherine Caspers, makes sure that it is recorded on our Facebook Page. I thank our community for the gathering and the support this year. It is in the gathering that our young people are given a chance to connect to a wonderful spirit and tradition. We are a place of ritual. It makes a difference.

The beauty of our gatherings included the Dux Assembly when our Mayor spoke to us, the National Sorry Day, and Anzac Day and the November 11 silence. It was deep and profound.

The College celebrated National Reconciliation Week. Both campuses celebrated this at the new gymnasium with an assembly. The feature moment was Jayden Peabody reading his prose poem in front of the 900 students. There was an anti-bullying orange day at Benedict and Bosco. The Royal Show created success with the animals and Elke Holze introduced honey producing bees to go along with the egg producing chickens and the bacon producing pigs. Only the bees and the chickens seemed happy. The pigs are still considering their significant commitment. Farmer Joel Head and Ag Teacher Brett Hay seem to be doing something very special with the wine production. They are creating some wonderful shiraz flavours.

Even our sports assembly was special as we welcomed back old scholar Andrew Waters and he told of the legacy of St Mark's sport. It was a time when our champions were acknowledged. I assured Andrew that St Mark's students can still play and the Benedict and Bosco children applauded excellence and involvement.

There is a football team this year that I can't ignore. After 25 years we won our division in the state knockout competition. The Xavier College students visited us and we won our Intercollegiate Dennis Handley Cup with a 7 - 0 drubbing. Our footballers were strong, our netballers take no prisoners and our soccer boys won the most intense penalty shootout.

We ran a Colour Burst and had the best fun becoming rainbow warriors. The NAPLAN tests were on line as were some Year 12 exams. One of our teachers was even on My Kitchen Rules. That was interesting for us all.

The musical was a precious moment. Beauty and the Beast is about seeing beyond the façade and in seeing the best in the person not the beast in the person. The person is then transformed into their best. It's a beautiful theme about love and courage and the impact we have on one another and that is what we try to live out in our College and our Benedict and Bosco theatre students were extraordinary.

A spirituality of hearts and help

I think we share with Don Bosco a commitment to hearts and a Good Samaritan commitment to pick up someone who needs help. I think that we genuinely cared about each other and we stumbled imperfectly trying to do that. I thank the community for their commitment. Bishop Greg O'Kelly announced that our new Chaplain was Fr Jimmy Pantin and he has worked so hard to support the faith life of our College. I remember the graciousness of our bishop as he invited our Year 7s to confirmation. I honour the pilgrims who went to the Philippines and thank them for the courage to serve, to journey, raise funds, and search. I thank the teachers of the sacramental programs that led the children to reconciliation and Eucharist. We experienced the power of liturgy. It's deep impact on us remains. We enjoy a series of class and whole school Masses and the Candle Mass was an expression of our family with a particular joy in the Reception hand over of candles. The series of retreats from Year 6 to Year 12 gave us an intimacy and cohesion. It was beautiful and fragile, warm and unifying. The Blessing of the Fleet sees many St Mark's families involved but we stop for a moment to see the fairy tale quality of the debutants. The students are conscious of faithfulness within the challenges of the Religious Education program. The tremendous Graduation for the Year 12s filled hearts because so many were now so accomplished and we had a chance to pray about that.

The joy and heroism of learning

This community is about the learning. Every day. The heroism is in lesson preparation and participation. It's about homework and responding to challenge. It's about shared commitment to skills and study and the daily engagement. It's always about the joy of reading and the discoveries of this extraordinary world. The Junior Primary program is a celebration of that. Our teachers set up an environment that creates a discipline and an excitement for learning. They love their subjects and they care deeply for the students. I thank them. We produced great learners and leaders, there was academic achievement, moments of blessing and quite inspiring scholarship.

In April, SEQTA Engage was made available to parents of students in Year 7 - 12. SEQTA Engage is a powerful tool for parents/ caregivers. It provides an overview of your child's learning. SEQTA Engage allows you, as the parent/caregiver, to: monitor and checks assessments, send emails and view absences.

A focus for Benedict has been setting up a new program called Cars'n'Stars for our students in Year 5/6. The Year 5s also worked in literacy and numeracy workshops that enhanced their learning.

Mental Health Workshop: The Let's Talk About It: Mental Health Fitness workshop for all of our students was held. Issues include: Understand your mental health and wellbeing; Break down stigma about mental health. I was fortunate to attend the graduation ceremony of our Little Lions.

Grandparents and parents with the Year 6 buddies and Reception classmates attended. I told them about the opportunity that awaits them at St Mark's.

The results for the Year 12 Research Project were outstanding. We enjoyed a public viewing of the projects at the end of last term and then the results came out. Quite outstanding experience of learning, independence and confidence. We had 51% in the A Grade band.

There is an extraordinary joy about Book Week. Classrooms are decorated, assemblies held, books are read and there is a parade of dress ups and a funny commentary. Benedict does this with enormous energy.

There were significant individuals who stood thoughtful, sensitive, courageous and determined. There were talents nurtured, and abilities cultivated. It happened at St Mark's. I hope that parents who entrust us so deeply with the care and welfare of their child will sense that ritual, fun and challenge, deep support, growth, learning, and community have made an impact on their child.

Leading into Spirit

And it has been a wonderful year for leadership. I applaud our Year 12 Captains and the manner in which they created House spirit or College excellence. I applaud the Benedict House Captains because they seem to grasp opportunity with such enthusiasm and they build spirit and care. I enjoyed seeing the determination that they had. Millie Tubb and Jack Dickeson were tremendous young people as College Captains. I acknowledge the superb work of Benedict Captains Zoe and Mitchell. They are loyal and dedicated and very friendly and the SRC have done good work all year.

Thank you

We offered a farewell to some teachers: Poonam Kataria finished her contract with us. She had been a bright and faithful teacher with an enormous passion for science and things mathematical. We said thank you Miss Penny Malchow and we will remember her gentleness and care of the Year 1s. We said farewell to Jane Klinger as she heads to Adelaide and say thanks especially for her numeracy leadership. We thanked Ken Fay for his loyal service to the College. He has a love of literature, and a particular soccer team, and has a dedication to students that inspired. And finally Jesslyn Byerlee will take a year away to nurture a brand new little baby. I thanked her for her work over the last eight years. She has grown into an amazing teacher and her night life was just about to take off.
