Salesian House is a special place and the formation of its community, with its goodness, and its customs, is powerful, and will have a big influence on their child this year. The boarding process is one of routine, structure and relationship. Young people will learn plenty. They will learn plenty in the classroom, learn about challenge of resilience, of being alone and doing it themselves, and growing personal qualities at Salesian House.

Mr Forster read in the gospel on our first night about an argument by the disciples about who was the greatest. It's a strange question in Salesian House. Boarding probably doesn't have too much of that. 'The greatest' doesn't happen here. There is too much respect for building a good community and for making things work. There may be the nosiest, chattiest, messiest, maybe the quietest, or the funniest, but I can't imagine 'the greatest'. Our experience, especially when we start the year, is about innocence, about vulnerability, about naive enthusiasm for a place and we anticipate a good time and an opportunity. That's what happens at Salesian House. No 'greatest' because this place has a simple enthusiasm, a respectful innocence. The secret of Salesian House is its goodness. Its goodness is contagious. That's what great.

I write with the highest confidence in David and Denise. They work hard and work with deep insight and a sense of vocation and care. Jane and Lisa organise and support. It will go well.


Mums and dads supports us in our efforts and we will honour their sacrifice and trust in sending sons and daughters here. And they are making sacrifices. We know that.
