Uniform

All students were given two visual laminated posters last week. One was who their teachers are and what specialist lesson they have on each day. The other was a visual schedule of which uniform to wear on which day. If these have been misplaced, please see our friendly office staff for a new copy.

Just a reminder that it is against school policy for students to have a SMART watch at school. Students are permitted to wear a watch; however, the watch should not be able to be used to call, message, take photos or videos or play music. Please be mindful that if students are wearing a SMART watch they will be asked to remove it.

Before School

As a school we have a duty of care to ensure your child/ren are adequately supervised at all times. Therefore, please ensure that your child/ren are not on school grounds before 8.15am. If they do present at school before 8.15am they will be taken to the OSHC service located at Benedict. Families will be billed for this service. OSHC opens at 6.30am each morning and provides supervision and breakfast for students until 8.30am when classrooms are open.

Please be reminded that if you enter the school ground before 8.25am you are required to wait in the Quad area. After 8.25am you are then able to enter the Junior Primary, Middle Primary and Wonderland.

Car Park

At the start of every school year there is always a period of refreshing ourselves with the regular routines in getting back to school. We also welcome new people within our community. We are very lucky with the facilities we have at our school and we are the only school in Port Pirie to have a car park.
