Truth Telling

This week members of the Leadership Team attended the Diocesan Assembly, a gathering of religious, lay leaders and parishioners from across the vast Diocese of Port Pirie. The theme of the Assembly was 'Proclaim, Serve and Build'. Among the many good news stories, two of our Year 12 students, Ruby and Ella spoke of the focus on social action at St Mark's College. They shared their own experience of participating in the Vinnies Sleepout last year, and how their learning about homelessness in Australia inspired the year level to raise over \$20,000 for the St Vincent de Paul Society. Not only did they speak with confidence, but their pride in the College was evident and complimented by attendees. I could not have been more proud listening to Ruby and Ella articulate the importance of Catholic Social Teaching in helping to shape our students into good people who are building on the mission of Jesus and living out the Gospel values in their daily lives.

We are all God's people. None of us live or act in isolation. As such we have a responsibility to be aware of our impact, on the environment, and on the people around us, locally and further afield. Just as a pebble dropped into a pond sends ripples out that extend beyond the place of impact, so our words and actions send out ripples far beyond our immediate vicinity or our conscious awareness.

At the Assembly, Fr Jim Monaghan, Vicar-General of our Diocese, spoke of the importance of 'truth telling' in the Church, but this also made me reflect on truth telling in our College community. When any incident occurs, if we are going to move forward, we need to speak the truth, hear the truth, and take responsibility for the truth of what has

been and what is. Taking responsibility for the truth of words and actions can be difficult for adults let alone children and young people, but as parents and educators we serve our children well if we support them to develop this quality. It is the foundation of growth, responsibility, repair, and reconciliation.

Society is messy and schools are too. St Mark's is no different in being a microcosm of society, and people do not always behave as they should. Lots is written in the media and on local social media pages about bullying. In an ideal world we would not hear words that are designed to hurt or see actions that cause physical and emotional harm. But we do not live in an ideal world. We live in that messy world where we do our very best to work through issues as they arise and educate students about the impact of bullying and harassment, in person and in the cyber world of digital communication. I see how hard teachers work in this space, which comes from our care for students and our mission to be a safe place that teaches and lives Gospel values. We do not take bullying behaviours lightly; pretend they do not occur or push them under the carpet. We work with students and families to name and own what is happening, re-educate, and accept consequences as part of restoration and repair.

Truth telling is important and it is essential for all of us at St Mark's College, parents, and teachers, to support our young people in acknowledging and taking responsibility for their actions, so that every person has the conditions that will enable them to feel that they belong and can flourish. This is hard, ongoing work, but together we will make a difference.

Students were presented with some startling facts and figures about homelessness in Australia, where the number of people who find themselves homeless is on a massive increase.

In their SRM classes, students are further studying the Catholic Social Teachings of the Church, especially on 'Human dignity' and 'Preferential option for the poor and vulnerable'. Students immediately began creating their fundraising campaigns for the sleepout, and within 24 hours had raised more than \$7,500. What's been happening in Year 3

This week I popped into 3 Red to hear about all the wonderful learning that has been happening this term. The students were very engaged in telling me what has been happening in the past few weeks.

Isla started by telling me that "in Science we have been learning about plants and they are up on the windowsill". Each student has a bean plant up on their windowsill which they are using as an experiment to see how "plants grow how they are supposed to and how they survive" (Ethan). The class has explored how "plants reproduce and the life cycle of a plant" (Cheston). Delany said that they have also been learning about the life cycle of a frog.

In Mathematics the Year 3s have been learning about 3D shapes and their properties (Dillon).

In HASS "we have been learning about celebrations and commemorations" (Zed). Harlow was able to tell me that "commemorations" are when we remember someone or something. Celebrations are celebrating something that has happened". Ethan told me that "Celebrations are traditions that happen every year".

The past two weeks have been very busy in our Year 3 and 5 classrooms. Teachers have been providing opportunities for students to engage with a range of guestion styles in order to prepare them for NAPLAN. Emersyn said that the Year 3s had been doing NAPLAN too see what they know in different areas. Ollie enjoyed doing the Numeracy test as she felt like "you get to learn more things". Delany enjoyed the Conventions of Language as she loves spelling. Others enjoyed the writing as they could fix up sentences and check if they were constructed properly. Others enjoyed the reading as they have a passion for reading.

On Tuesday we welcomed Andrew Chinn into our school. Andrew worked as a classroom teacher in Catholic Primary Schools in Sydney, Australia for nearly twenty years before moving into his full time music ministry. Andrew has visited more than 1100 Catholic primary schools, performing in 3000 concerts across Australia, New Zealand, the USA and Canada sharing his music and his faith with children, teachers and parents. He has released 12 albums, 5 DVDs and 6 picture books, which are used widely by teachers and catechists in the faith development of children. In recent years he has developed the Butterfly House, an online RE
