Principal's Update T2, W4

Last week we celebrated Catholic Education Week, an annual event, but one made more special this year as it coincides with 180 years of Catholic education in South Australia, and the Jubilee Year of Hope.

"180 years of Catholic education in South Australia is an outstanding achievement and one that we should all be proud of. It is important to reflect on the early mission of Catholic education, to provide faith-based instruction to our young irrespective of their background," says Dr Neil McGoran, Executive Director of Catholic Education South Australia (CESA).

"This year the Shine with Open Hearts theme for Catholic Education Week reminds us of the identity, mission, and enduring values that guide our schools. Catholic Education Week is a time to reflect on our shared journey, celebrate our achievements, and look to the future with hope and open hearts."

At the Catholic Education Awards last Thursday, it was a great honour to see Joel Head receive the outstanding ESO Award for his work at the College building and delivering our Trades Skills and Agricultural Programs. Joel's passion for the mission of the College, his

This week, we also marked our own Golden Jubilee, celebrating 50 years since the amalgamation of four Catholic schools in Port Pirie to become St Mark's College. Over the years Catholic education and St Mark's College have evolved and adapted to meet the needs of students and families and respond to changes in curriculum, teaching practices and legislative requirements. However, as Dr Neil McGoran states, what has not changed are the fundamentals – the identity, mission and values of Catholic education that embrace all, inclusively and with compassion and understanding for personal circumstances.

Some may refer to St Mark's College as a private school, but we are proudly a Catholic school, embracing all that represents. The term 'private' suggests an exclusivity and inaccessibility that does not align with the mission of Catholic education or the Good Samaritan and Salesian Traditions on which we are founded. In our special Mass this week to celebrate our Jubilee and the Feast of Our Lady of Help of Christians, we reflected on the strong foundations of our history and the shoulders who have gone before us, lifting us up to be who and what we are today. As Robert Penn Warren, an American poet, wrote, 'History cannot give us a program for the future, but it can give us a fuller understanding of ourselves, and of our common humanity, so that we can better face the future'.

There is no greater time than now to reflect on what it means to be a Catholic School – to be compassionate, loving and inclusive in everything we do.

Catholic Education Week Mass

We also recognised our Good Samaritan Sisters who have been present in Port Pirie since 1889 and the Salesian Order since the 1950s. Jubilee Mass and Activities Day

On Thursday this week, we celebrated the Golden Jubilee of St Mark's College with a Mass and Activities afternoon. Our celebrant was Bishop Karol, who joined the Director of Catholic Education, Ms Nichii Mardon, and our Principal, Dr Sandra Hewson, in leading these celebrations.

To commemorate the occasion, a mural was commissioned by our resident Art Teacher and Old Scholar, Mrs Megan Congdon, that represents the vibrant and dynamic history of the different parts of the community that make up St Mark's College today.

We had a video montage of snapshots from each year in the 50-year history of St Mark's College to conclude the event. Many familiar faces could be seen over the years, which everyone enjoyed.

The occasion was also celebrated with sausages and cake at lunchtime, as well as a canned drinks sale to raise funds for the Philippines Immersion.

Benedict and Bosco classes buddied up to play team activities in the House Teams in the afternoon. Classic games of 'tunnel ball' and 'duck, duck, goose' could be seen across the hockey turf, oval and Good Samaritan Hall venues.

Our guests were hosted for lunch following the Mass and toured the College as the festivities for the students continued.

A big thank you to all in our St Mark's community who contributed and assisted on the day, to make it a memorable event in the history of our school for all involved.

Sacramental Programme

As a celebration of the papal encyclical's 10 year anniversary, the week highlighted what things still need to be done to respond to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. Our leaders of ecological action, Mrs Megan Congdon and Sr Marie O'Shea sgs, continue to publicise the initiatives we have implemented in the parish and school. We continue to pray for their work in this vital area of ecological justice – our dependence on Mother Earth is essential to the survival of all life on this planet. We have no plan B! We must appreciate and protect God's creation as stewards, not plunderers, for the sake of our future and of all life.

Winter Uniform



Tips from our School Counsellors, T2, W4



Empowering your child when they ask for Help

Requesting help can often feel intimidating and may be perceived negatively, but it should not be. Encouraging your children to seek help can be empowering and is a crucial skill for their success. When your child asks for help, respond positively and reinforce the importance of seeking assistance when needed.

For example, you might say:

- "I'm really proud of you for asking for help. Let's work this out together!"
- "I appreciate that you asked for help! It shows you're really trying to learn"
- "It was very brave of you to ask for help, how can I help you?"

How can I ask for support?

Asking for help is not a sign of weakness, in fact it can mean just the opposite, it can be the most courageous thing you do. Knowing when and understanding how to ask for help is an essential part of learning and can help you reach your academic and wellbeing goals.

Here are some tips to help make asking for help easier:

· Ask early, not last minute

Developing skills of asking for help starts with noticing when you need it. The key is asking before it gets out of hand, so if you ever find yourself struggling to understand academically or emotionally, ask for clarification or seek support.

Know who to ask

As important as knowing when to ask, is knowing who to ask. If you are struggling with a subject, ask the teacher of that lesson. If you are looking for communication skills or emotional support, ask your Homegroup teacher to link you up with the school counsellor. If you are struggling to talk to your Homegroup teacher reach out to another trusted adult or friend to help you connect.

• Be clear and specific

Know what you want to ask or say and be concise. To effectively communicate what you need, it is important to use clear and precise language and always remember to express gratitude to those who listen or offer to help.

• Follow up

If you feel your situation or understanding has not improved seek more clarification or speak to another trusted person who will be able to follow up with you on your concern.

· Seek professional support

If you are experiencing stress related to school expectations, reach out to your Homegroup teacher, wellbeing officer or your school counsellor.

Remember: It is normal (and even smart) to ask for help, in fact, teachers expect students to ask questions. No one understand everything right away and sometimes we need extra information, and the more you do it, the easier it gets.
