#### **Keeping Our School Community Healthy**

As we navigate through the rest of the school year together, the health and well-being of our students, staff, and families remain our top priority. With the changing seasons and the increase in common illnesses, we want to remind everyone of the importance of keeping children home when they are sick.

Why It's Important:

When children come to school while unwell, they risk spreading illnesses to their classmates and teachers. This can lead to more widespread absences and disrupt the learning environment for everyone. By keeping your child home when they are sick, you help protect the entire school community.

Signs Your Child Should Stay Home:

Please keep your child at home if they exhibit any of the following symptoms:

- Fever (38°C or higher)
- · Persistent coughing or sneezing
- Sore throat, runny or stuffy nose
- · Vomiting or diarrhea
- · Fatigue or body aches

If Your Child Is Sick:

Notify the School: Inform the school of your child's absence and the reason for it.

Seek Medical Advice: Consult with your healthcare provider to determine the best course of action.

Rest and Recover: Ensure your child gets plenty of rest and fluids to recover quickly.

Returning to School: Children should only return to school when they are symptom-free for at least 24 hours without the aid of medication. This helps ensure they are fully recovered and reduces the risk of spreading illness to others.

We understand that keeping your child home can be inconvenient, but it is a crucial step in maintaining a healthy school environment. Thank you for your cooperation and commitment to the well-being of our school community.


